## Whose Timing

My garden experience this year has been an exercise in frustration. It seemed a little early to plant in the nice weather we had in early Spring. That proved to be well founded concern when the freezing temperatures came back. Around Mother's Day is the "right" time for planting if one is to follow the customs of the past which would have me setting in a good place. That is until you have to deal with all the wet weather we have been getting. I have been told that soil that is too wet is not good for the seeds and after the wet stretch we have been in, my garden is not ready to till unless I want to carry more mud than dirt on the tiller tines.

My plan for planting would have been alright but the weatherpersons tell us that a tropical storm has stopped the movements of the low pressure system that has kept us in cool and damp conditions for the past few days. Without the storm in the Atlantic, the weather was supposed to be warm and dry, perfect for getting the seeds in the ground. It seems that just as the garden dries out more rain is predicted.

While timing is important in many things, I think that this year my garden will just have to survive with a late planting. My timing is not so crucial as long as God gives the right growing conditions once I do get the seeds in the ground. This makes me wonder if I ever mess up the planning that God has in my life? Am I so busy waiting for the perfect weather, the perfect opportunity or the perfect place to do what God has commanded for all of us to do? The command to go and spread the Good News does not come with limitations for weather or place or opportunity. So am I missing opportunity that is right in front of me because I am not ready?

God sent the Apostles out and made sure they would go by causing hardship to come upon them, taking them out of their comfort zone and into the wonders of His plan. Leaving Jerusalem and the comfort of being able to depend on one another was not what they likely wanted. Sent was not to be considered an option but a new command. The time for sitting at Jesus' feet was over and he left them to return to heaven. We do know that he did not leave them empty handed but blessed with the power of the Holy Spirit.

Emboldened with the new Breath of Heaven, they spoke with clarity about the love that God has for all creation. There is no room for keeping such good news to one's self. News this good must be shared so they were sent out to all the world. This is the garden of God. To make the matters of faith grow in the people of the world. So what are we doing to plant the seeds of faith and hope? What are we doing to bring the lost into the Kingdom of Heaven?



